Principal report:

Greetings everyone,

April is one of those months where, if you blink, you miss a lot. With Easter Holidays smack dab in the middle of the month, we only have 15 school days.

Farmers will be venturing into the fields, and as we know, long days of work make for short months, as we race the calendar to get crops in the ground.

The school is a hive of activity in April, and some of the activities make their way outdoors, so it does feel in some ways like we are emerging from a period of hibernation. The Greenhouse is set up and ready for another season, the playground has been inspected and deemed fit, and Horizon groundskeepers will soon be out to get the watering system ready for the upcoming warm weather.

Students are currently pursuing a number of athletic and academic endeavours. Our grade 3-5 basketball season will wrap up this month, and grade 6-12 badminton has begun in earnest. Warner School is very happy to recognize our students who took part in Archery Provincials in Edmonton recently. While nearly all of our 9-member team shot very well under the watchful eye of Coach Heppler, we are thrilled to announce that Kaleb Routley earned himself a podium finish, as he placed 2nd amongst grade 11 shooters. In addition to Kaleb's strong performance, we had an up-and-coming star performance from Jacey Cronkhite, as she placed 8th in her category. Congratulations to the entire team (Kaleb, Jaylen, Austin, Jaydan, Kelcey, Avery, Jacey, Owen, and Kolton). It was as enjoyable as a weekend in Edmonton (without a visit to the mall) could possibly be.

A couple of years ago, the Government of Alberta changed the funding model for high school students. School jurisdictions are now funded on a per student basis, not by credits earned. I agree with the philosophy behind this adjustment, as some of the students who struggled the most academically were not supported to the same extent financially as those who acquired credits at a high rate. I will say, however, that the current crop of grade 11 students has gone far above and beyond typical expectations. We already have two students who have surpassed 100 credits! While the resurrection of the GREEN program in Alberta has benefited our students (and their credit counts), I am deeply concerned that changes to farm insurance requirements could lead to issues in this course offering. GREEN used to cost the student several hundred dollars per course, as Alberta Education had to provide insurance for the students taking the classes. Currently, the GREEN courses are free to students, as a beneficial aspect of Bill 6 was the insurance coverage. Whatever amendments are made to farm safety regulations, I do hope that this program remains viable for our students.

Grad plans are underway. Look for some of the Covid traditions to continue - read DRIVE PAST - while we also add some other aspects that this year's graduates have requested. MAY 27th is the big day, and the community drive past through the bus loop will begin at 5PM. This activity was, as stated earlier, something that developed during the protocols. The students in past years commented on how much they appreciated seeing everyone (and some of the sweet rides - direct student quote), and this year's group wanted to maintain this (now) tradition. Our Grad Theme this year is CAMPING/BEACH, should you have the inclination to incorporate this into your vehicle's motif.

Wood Shop: The wood shop will be opening again this spring with Mr. Korol taking over the duties! This class will also be offered on Fridays during option classes.


