At 6:00PM, Graduates and their families will go into the gym to receive their certificates and have a pizza

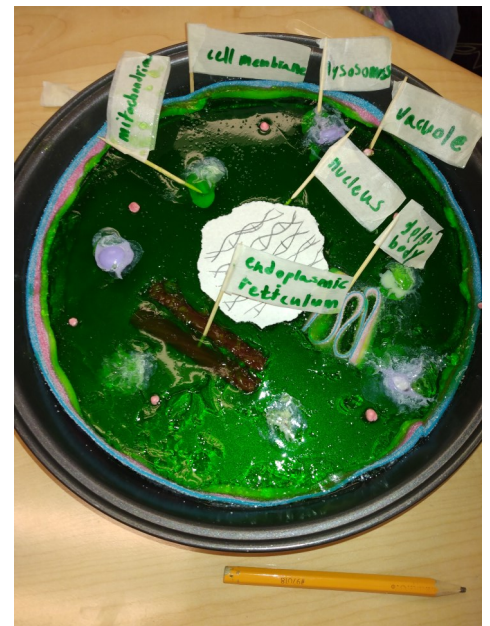


Back Row: Left-Cody Paul, Middle-Silvio Contreras, Right- Joseph Feist

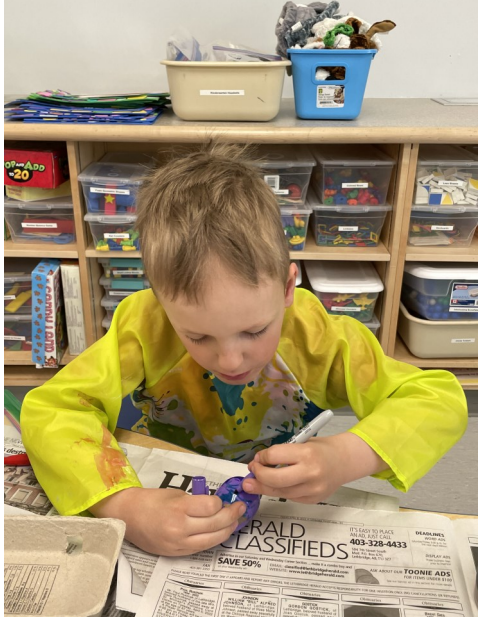

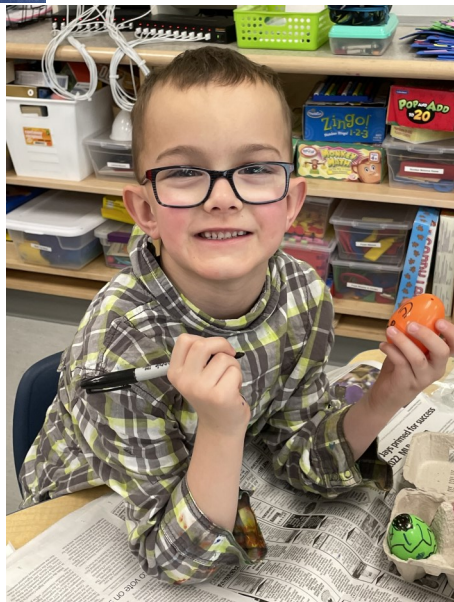
As part of our fundraising students researched Ukraine and Doctors Without Borders (Medicine Sans Frontier) in small groups for an educational presentation for the donation page. As part of the research process we were lucky enough to get to Zoom call with a Ukrainian Albertan who has been doing Ukrainian dance for almost 30 years and has been to Ukraine twice to visit family and train with a dance group there. We were also able to have someone come talk to the class who has previously worked locally for Doctors Without Borders back in 2010 organizing locally to help with the Haiti earthquake and students were able to learn about what some of their money would go to including various lifesaving materials. Thanks to our older students in the Jr./Sr. High foods class, grade $\frac{2}{3}$ wrapped up with making and eating handmade perogies! Also thanks to the time of many parents and other staff, and the generosity of a teacher in Milk River who supplied the tools, we were able to decorate beautiful Easter eggs called Pysanky in the traditional Ukrainian way. Thank you again to all those who bought eggs. We hope they made your Easter a little bit brighter and festive!
