Physics 20

We recently wrapped up our Kinematics unit in Physics 20 in which we studied how objects move. To explore kinematics in real life, students built structures to launch a tennis ball and used their data and observations to mathematically determine the ball's velocity. There were some very creative and unique approaches to building our projectile launchers and we had a blast testing out the final products.





The grade 8/9 Science class attempted to find out the density of a human being. We first weighed the student volunteer and then found their volume using a supersized displacement can (aka a modified garbage can)




