Principal's Report Hello Families,

It's hard to believe we're already well into April! Warner School has been buzzing with field trips, March Madness activities, new CTF/CTS classes, and athletics.

Field Trips

Students and parent volunteers had a great time creating clay animal sculptures at the Coutts Historical School with artist Cindy Clarke. Mrs. Thompson brought the sculptures back to school after they were fired in the kiln, and students painted them using tempera paint.

Next Tuesday, Mrs. McMurray and her PSII student teacher, Ms. Vossebelt, will take the Grade 4–7 students to the Galt Museum to participate in programs related to the Social Studies curriculum.

March Madness

Warner participated in March Madness—also known as the NCAA basketball playoffs! In the lower grades, the excitement took the form of a "March Madness of Books," which you can read more about in this newsletter.

In Grades 6/7 Science, Mr. Zink ran "March Mammal Madness." Starting with 64 mammals, students used characteristics like adaptations and habitats to determine which would win. The eventual champion: the Polar Bear!

School-wide, each class was assigned NCAA tournament picks and posted the teams' mascots on classroom doors. As teams were eliminated, the mascots were taken down. The Grade 4/5 class came out on top with the Florida Gators among their picks!



March Madness in Grade"s K-3


