
Graduation






Fantastic Field Trip!

On behalf of our local solar facilities, we wanted to let you know that we are now accepting scholarship applications for the BluEarth Renewables Scholarship Program. The program provides scholarships to post-secondary students with a focus on students in close proximity to where we live, work and operate.

We currently have three scholarship categories available to students:

- **Community Leaders Scholarship:** Building strong communities relies on many people. This scholarship is awarded to students who demonstrate a commitment to giving back to their community and making the world a better place for their generation and generations to come.
- **Renewable Energy Trades Scholarship:** We are committed to helping grow the renewable energy sector and supporting the skilled workers who will lead the way. This scholarship is awarded to students enrolled in a renewable energy trades program.
- Indigenous Peoples Scholarship: At part of our commitment to building mutually-beneficial relationships with Canada's Indigenous communities, we award scholarships to Indigenous students to help develop their skills and knowledge in the renewable energy sector.

Successful candidates will be provided with financial support of up to \$3,000 for the academic year, as well as the opportunity to be matched with a BluEarth mentor and learning partner for two-way communication to inspire, challenge and motivate. Applications are reviewed by our selection committee based on the case for financial support, academic merit, community involvement, pursuit of studies that could be transferable to the renewable energy sector and/or environmental stewardship, and proximity to the locations where we live, work and operate.


College Exploratory Days, RAP and Work Experience
